#### f. Update on New Elementary School Project and Elementary School Design

Tim Burge, the Construction Superintendent for Skanska, presented a report on the new elementary school project and updated the School Board on the construction project.

# March 24, 2021

Construction activity is underway with the installation of erosion and sediment control (E&S) measures and temporary power for job site trailers. Quesenberry's is also mobilizing equipment in order to commence excavation in anticipation of VDEQ approval by the end of March.

A proposal for testing & inspections for the building package was reviewed and approved in mid-March. Planning for the procurement of FF&E, technology and low voltage systems continue.

The project remains within the overall budget and on schedule with substantial completion anticipated for late summer 2022.

# g. Approval of the 2021- 2022 Budget

Ron Vicars presented to the School Board members an update on the FY22 Budget.

# <u>Dickenson County Public Schools budget update Fiscal Year 2022</u>

- •The Virginia General Assembly passed the FY22 State Budget on Saturday, February 27
- •Included a 5% pay increase for all SOQ recognized instructional and support positions
- •Fully funds the "No Loss" funding to protect school divisions from drops in their Average Daily Membership
- •Learning Loss Supplemental Payments to assist school divisions in providing additional learning opportunities due to instructional losses during the COVID-19 Pandemic

#### Federal update

•CRRSA Act (Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations) will be a part of the final budget. Federal funds are given to assist school divisions in addressing learning loss among at-risk students, provide school facility improvements to mitigate the risk of virus transmission, and improve environmental quality in school buildings.

#### **Budget Perimeters**

- Budget projections are based on the House bill o Included support for the 5% pay increases
- •Based on an ADM of 1,885 o Projections consider projected Kindergarten students arriving, seniors departing, and additional projected losses through the year
- Minimum Wage increases to \$9.50 in May 2021 and \$11.00 in January 2022 which will impact both this year's budget and next year's budget.

Local budget meetings are scheduled for Tuesday, Mar. 30<sup>th</sup> at 1:00 p.m. between members of the School Board and the Board of Supervisors.

# h. Discussion of the Participation for the 2021-2022 DCPS Virtual Regional Program

Senate Bill 1303 in the General Assembly was approved and is awaiting the Governor's signature. As you recall, Senate Bill 1320 requires each school division to offer fully in-person instruction or a combination of in-person and remote virtual instruction to each student for the duration of 2021 – 2022.

At this point, what appears to be certain is that school divisions in Virginia will have to offer a remote/virtual program for students for the 2021 – 2022 school year.

On Friday, Mar. 19, 2021, The DCPS Administrative Staff met with Edgenuity and participated in the presentation. Edgenuity was looked at extensively.

After discussions with the Leadership Staff on Monday, Mar. 22, 2021, additional time was requested to allow the Administrative Staff to 1. evaluate the cost. 2. Have a list of prerequisites for students to be a part of the virtual program next year.

# i. Approval of the 2020 - 2021 School Calendar

At this time, it appears the state of Virginia will allow school divisions up to 10 Virtual Learning Days for instruction for possible inclement weather or other emergency type closures. This would assist the school division in making up missed days next year. Anything beyond the 10 days potentially would need to be added to the end of the school calendar.

Two surveys were made available during the week of March 10<sup>th</sup> – 17<sup>th</sup> for participation from both the Dickenson County Public Schools faculty and staff members as well as parents, guardians, and the community. The survey allowed individuals to choose between the two options being considered.

#### March 24, 2021

The faculty and staff survey saw 232 participants. Option 1 had 100 votes for 43% and Option 2 had 132 votes for 57%.

The parent, guardian, and community survey saw 254 participants. Option 1 had 142 votes for 56% and Option 2 had 112 votes for 44%.

Following a motion by Dr. Lurton Lyle and a second by Damon Rasnick Option 1 for the 2021-2022 calendar was approved as presented. (Vote passed 4-1)

#### VI. BOARD COMMENT

**Rick Mullins:** I was just thinking with April Hay making her presentation, this has really been wonderful. We have some talented little writers. We may even have some new David Baldacci's here. I would also like to make the comment that I was over at UVA-Wise yesterday and was talking to the nurse practitioners and one of their sons came in who works for Norton

Community Hospital. They got to talking about Ridgeview High School and everything that has been done over there. The son has never been here to look at the facility and they were all saying you need to go, you need to go, it's the greatest facility in Southwest Virginia, and not only is it the greatest facility, the education is wonderful. That made me so proud to hear that.

**Dr. Lurton Lyle:** I am interested to see how this Virtual Regional Program is going to go. Other than that I think we have done well this evening so far.

Jason Hicks: I'd like to congratulate those writers as well. That's quite an accomplishment for sure, to get what was it, five out of six that's pretty impressive. I did find it interesting that in the poetry section two of the titles are anxiety and stress. I think that really reflects what students and administrators, our teachers, and parents, everybody involved, kind of what is being really reflected in there. Even with all that stress and anxiety, I want to take a minute to brag on our teachers. I happened to be in a conference, a virtual online conference, probably about a month or so ago on YouTube. There were thousands of people in this conference. I looked over in the comments because people were commenting the whole time and I saw one of our teachers' names pop up there. It was flying so fast to be able to catch one in there was kind of amazing. This was on a virtual day she had virtual duties at that time. Not only was she fulfilling her duties teaching she was also trying to slip in some time to improve herself and improve her skills at the same time. With all the anxiety and stress and all that has been going on. I really think that speaks to the caliber of teachers that we have in the county. It even speaks the caliber of those people. I know that there were more than one of our teachers that were in that thing at the end but they just didn't make a comment so I didn't get to see it. I thought that was really something and I shared it with the board. I'm always impressed by what folks are doing and taking on extra at the same time. I was pretty excited this week that we got Go Guardian here within the county. If you don't know what Go Guardian is, it filters contents out for our students whether they are on campus or whether they're off-campus. It's really helpful in trying to keep our kids safe from what they see online. Another great part of it was and I was very pressed by the teaching tools that go along with it. Teachers when they log on to their classroom they can see every student's chrome book whether they are a remote student or whether they are sitting there in front of them in class. That can be pretty helpful. I have already seen some kids get Youtube busted more than once since go Guardian has been there. I really thought it was funny the first time we sat in on a webinar to see this and one of my coworkers has a son in second or third grade. He sat with his father while they were doing this presentation. He shared with me after it was done that his second-grade son said do you mean that thing is going to snitch on us? Not only that the teacher can share the screen out, but that can also be shown to the students whether in the classroom or whether they're sitting at home so I think that's going to be a big help to our teachers and I know that's something that they got some training and things coming up on. It's going to be helpful to them, so again in the midst of all this, we're still trying to improve our skills and do those things. So my hats off to you.

**Damon Rasnick:** Mrs. Robinson I would like to think this achievement would get some wide dissemination that those students and teachers have achieved regarding the writing. I'd also like this time to thank the teachers and their parents and grandparents and caregivers, custodians, cooks, bus drivers, school nurses everybody that helps bring our children forward.

In reading that story I wish everybody could read it. It's talking about anxiety and stress in two of the writings that won in the competition. I suspect they could identify not only with all of our students but the teachers and parents and other caregivers as well. We've come a long way and I think it's been handled well but I think we have a ways to go. I just hope everything from here on out goes very well. Let's do everything we can to make it happen that way.

Jamie Hackney: I like all the sentiments that everyone's had about the writing students for what a great job that they did. I think that it's very very nice to recognize that and several have mentioned the teachers involved with that as well. I appreciate that as well. Also, I like to add that I'm pleased with the budget process this year. I thought it was very well prepared. Thank you all for doing a great job. I have not had nearly as much to say this year on the budget as I did last year so I hope that's a good sign. I feel like it was anticipated things, I anticipated more issues than we've had. I am very happy that it's all worked out. I was just thinking about it during the meeting tonight, about if we have to continue to have a good year next year if we continue with the budget cycle. I was thinking about if we were able to start looking at upgrading our bus fleet. I think one of the things looking down the road the next few years is having younger students travel a little longer distances to see if we're able to get air-conditioned buses for a few of those routes. It takes time to revamp the fleet. Down the road, if things are going well I hope as a Board we consider that as an option. But like I said once again I am very pleased with where we are right now. I am looking forward to next month and the next meeting.
